LAND USE e.g. Rainforest protection



HOUSEHOLD e.g. Clean cookstoves, clean water, household solar panels



GRID SCALE RENEWABLES e.g. Wind & solar projects

WHAT IS THE COST OF OFFSETTING MY FLIGHT?

We calculate your offset purchase by multiplying the carbon offset hourly rate for your aircraft type by total share size. Example as below:





Carbon offset hourly rate for Falcon 7X = £33.26/hour

£33.26/hour x 50 hours = £1663 total invoice for yearly carbon offset

When you opt into our carbon offset programme, your money will purchase third party verified and audited carbon credits, thereby supporting these high social and environmental impact projects.
